President's Report – Lloyd Mills



Firstly, welcome to all members and sponsors who are reading this Annual Report. I could start as had been stated in previous years as these are unprecedented times, but I think people are a bit over the term.

We were advised that we were to move into the newly completed Concord Oval firstly in February then April then June and then guaranteed to move in for our last game being the 6th of August 2022 unfortunately this did not eventuate due to a number of factors. However, there is light at the end of the tunnel as we are in the last throes of signing the updated Deed of Variation Agreement and anticipate being able to take possession of our area at Concord Oval within the next fortnight.

For all the hard work over the last 3 years I would like to gratefully thank Life Member and Past President Bob Ellis who has been negotiating and liaising with Canada Bay Council on our behalf, and Director Steve Jurd, and Life Member Ben Hall who followed through on all our requirements with Council and builders. Without these 3 gents, and Director Rory Sidey assisting with the legal requirements, we would not be in the position to move in. We will end up with the best playing surface and facilities, which will make us the envy of every Shute Shield Club in the competition.

Not having our own home ground and the wet weather impacted on our revenue for the year but with fiscal control from our Treasurer Mick Gray we managed to turn a surplus of \$61,183 for the year and have managed to repay monies owed from the previous year.

On the playing front we had Joe Barakat come back to the Club. First grade was very competitive as were shown by the results in the last 6 rounds, unfortunately a bit late in the season to vie for semis but I'm sure Joe will expand more fully in his report. Joe has decided to retire after the 2022 season to put his feet up and concentrate on his golf and we wish him all the best in his retirement. We thank him for the foundations he has put in place for our newly appointed full time Club Coach Cameron Treloar. Joe has advised he will assist our new coach when required, by acting as a mentor and sounding board to Cam when needed. The Club appointed Cam after an extensive interview process and interviewed a number of high-quality applicants, and we look forward to seeing the results improve on the field in 2023.

Our depth throughout the Grades was tested and is something we are working on to strengthen in 2023. Colts' results were very pleasing coming from having one team in 2021 to having 3 teams, with reserves in 2022, and 1st Grade Colts making the semis. Coach Josh Bray and Director Geoff Threlfo should be recognised and congratulated for putting the Colts program together. Josh will evaluate Colts results fully in his report and will be looking forward to more progress in 2023. We can only achieve success from growing our Local Juniors and Colts and making West Harbour the Club of choice for those players moving through to Grade.

You may be aware there was moves by some Clubs for us to merge with Penrith and Parramatta, but we withstood that move and achieved fielding 4 Grade and 3 Colts sides as per the SRU's Participation Agreement and are most proud of not forfeiting a game, whereas 2 Clubs did.

I would like to mention our Women's program separately and our Director of Women's Rugby Charmain Steventon, who started the year with no Women's team, and ended up competing in 7's and 10's tournaments. In 2023 we will be competing in 7's, 10's and fielding a team in the 15's Jack Scott Cup. Charmain has brought together an experienced Women Coaching and Management team and sourced Sponsorship from De Lorenzo for 2023. We are looking forward to what the Women's teams can achieve in 2023.

At the beginning of the year, we were required by the SRU Participation Agreement to have a full time General Manager, and after a wide ranging and extensive interview process, we appointed Dave Lyme to the position. Dave, an Australian, had been living in the US for the past 18 years where he ran a number of businesses and was heavily involved in Rugby development and coaching in the US, luckily, he was moving back to Australia. Dave has put in a tremendous amount of time since he started in February in building up relationships with NSW and Sydney Rugby Union and other Shute Shield Clubs' GM's and has also built relationships with Canada Bay Council, our neighbour West Tigers and our current sponsors. Being located at Burwood RSL's premises he has built up a good working relationship with their management team which was slightly fractured. Dave has put in time rewriting processes and procedures and liaised with all areas of our





coaching and management team. From a logistical perspective moving back to Concord Oval will make the game-day experience for our coaches, players, volunteers, members, sponsors, guests and public, a much better experience and hopefully increase our revenue.

We are also working hard to re-engage our old boys' 'Legends' network which is being coordinated through our Director, Grant Fenn, who will organise a number of functions for the 2023 season. We will shortly distribute a season calendar to lock in dates for 2023 including West Harbour Luncheon and Back to Wests Day on the same weekend.

I would also like to acknowledge Life Member and past President Geoff Harper who was West Harbour's Representative at the SRU and was instrumental in organising the highly successful West Harbour Luncheon.

The turnaround in performance for the colt's program was exceptional. Josh Bray had a huge job in front of him when he took the role and did an exceptional job. Women's Rugby is on track to become a powerhouse once again at West Harbour changing the lives of families with mothers and daughters playing - becoming role models and agents of positive change. We will continue to invest in the next generation of women rugby players and strive to implement quality programs that drive positive change within our community.

In Jan 2022 we started with 1 player! Fast forward 10 months:

- We have a squad of 28 women registered;
- We placed 5th in Sydney Women's Rugby 7s Competition;
- We came second in last Sydney Women's Rugby 10s tournament;
- We secured \$15k in minor sponsors -Suttons Homebush and Linkcon Projects;
- We received \$10,500 through our West Harbour Women's Foundation via https://asf.org.au/projects/west-harbour-rugby-football-club/west-harbour-womens-foundation
- Secured De Lorenzo as the Major Women's Sponsor from 2023 – 2025;
- Our u12s girls won the Sydney Junior Rugby 7s Competition;
- We are currently rolling out a Spring 12week 7s girls' program with over 35 girls registered;
- Launching a Girls Only Rugby Clinic at the newly revamped Concord Oval in the New Year;
- On Friday September 9th we hosted our annual West Harbour Pirates Club Presentation Night at Club Burwood RSL – Best Back, Serenity Loketi and Best Forward, Kowhai Ruawhare. We awarded the inaugural Charmain Steventon Award to Vilisi Matanimeke;
- We are pleased to announce that Kowhai Ruawhare has re-signed for the 2023

- season. An extraordinary player, she has been a solid leader and ball runner for the women's team so far this year. We look forward to seeing more of her in action in the Jack Scott Cup in 2023;
- Congratulations to our representative players from our women's programme. Sydney representatives: Kowhai Ruawhare & Victoria Hala'api'api'o Vava'u Cocker and International representative Serenity Loketi
 Mahoni Tonga 15s; and
- We have had overwhelming expression of interest for 2023 with 25 women wanting to play in 2023.

We are thrilled to announce we secured the services of Michael Nicoletti (3rd Grade Men's Coach) and Cas Van Rythoven. They have agreed to join the Women's program for the 2023 season and beyond. The Club is extremely pleased to have a coach of Mick and Cas's calibre join our ranks. There coaching resume is nothing short of impressive and over the years, they have filled numerous coaching roles. As the Head of Women's, Mick will work closely with myself. Mick brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the club that will not only see our Women's Open's program take the big step back to the Jack Scott Cup, but also develop our Junior Girls Players and Coaches, which will have a positive impact on our Women's program moving forward. Leni Kaufusi will continue our Team Manager.

2023 will be an immense year, one where we can build upon the momentum we have created. After a 15-year absence, we are planning to enter in the 15's Sydney Women's Rugby Competition (Known as Jack Scott Cup) in 2023.

I can assure you that the next phase of the West Harbour Women's story will be an exciting one, nothing will be more thrilling than running out on Concord Oval – our home ground.

1st XV Season Report – Joe Barakat



A new Coach, a different Shape in our attack and a new Philosophy in Defence, things were not necessarily going to gel straight away. I even indicated early on with this group that our early results were going to be a little volatile and yes they were.

Coming into this team, there were two areas that were recognised as our weakness from the previous year. They were our Defence and Lineouts. So not only were we changing our attack shape, we were also asking and expecting mo from one another, when we did not have the ball.

Our Lineout in 2021 was ranked in the bottom 3 in the competition, this needed an over haul, plus we also lost 2 of our Locks from 2021 as well. Our focus was to work on our Individual Skill and make sure our Lineout Calling was simple, so Tempo would be crucial for us winning our ball. Nearly 40% of all tries scored, have their origin from the Lineout, so winning our ball and disrupting the delivery of our opponents' ball was going to be high on our Agenda.

Making no excuses, there was a lot that needed to be done before we could get the consistency in our results. Along with this we were blooding new Locks and experimenting with our number 10.

We were competitive in all games bar one in the first 10 rounds. We won 2 of these games and lost another 7 in the last 10 minutes. Again, we had volatility in our results, but it was clear that we needed to work more on our conditioning and even more on reducing our errors and keeping the "Guy in the middle", controlling the game, on side.

We were very competitive but were ending up on the wrong side of the ledger. Damien Fleming and Prez Tufuga were exceptional in our Lineouts, attack and defence. Carlo Tizzano was also creating havoc with our opponents and was leading from the front. We were lucky to get Kali Nacina back to fill the void when Carlo left us to go overseas. Kali was exceptional.

The Lineout was no longer a weakness for us. Our backs were starting to Gel and the team was getting used to our new shape in attack and only got so

much better when we finally recruited Greg Hutley and welcomed back Jack Debreczeni. We finally had 2 excellent 10s. All this did was highlight the impact both our centres began to have on the competition. Chris Ebling and Kuki Ma'afu, were the best 12 and 13 in the Competition. Their attack and defence were feared by all of our opponents.

Around Round 12, we also had Paddy McBryde join the Pirate Gang. A Lock from Wales, he was the final piece of the puzzle needed and who also helped to mentor Cam Signorini and Tui Moana. He was tough in the tight and was what the doctor ordered. Our fortunes began to change. We also had Cameron Orr join us for the last 6 rounds of which we won 4 and drew 1. Our scrum was solid throughout the competition. Utilising Cam Betham, Navi Bolatagici and Sonny Satuala early in the season and then settling with Tangi Mafi, Siketi Tavao, Raukawa Neems and Cameron Orr. Our scrum was rarely challenged

We, as a team, had finally come through the Volatility and we were settling into our attack shape giving good service to our outside backs in Jiale Dawai, Justin Marsters and Kodie Hawkins, showing we could mix it with the best in the competition and win. It is fitting that we pay tribute to our players who enlisted in Australia's Armed Forces and saw active service overseas. It is known that at least 23 of them paid the supreme sacrifice. We list them to show our respect for them.

As Rugby was suspended during World War I, there is no known list of players who served and if one was made, it has been lost along with many other archives. With regards to World War II, a list was made of those players who died in the course of their military duty. This list was printed in the annual reports up to the 1970s but the practice was then discontinued. A list of known players from the 1930s and 1940s who joined the military was compiled. The list has been updated sporadically and is nowhere complete as there were many others who served since then, but their names are not recorded in the club's files. We apologise for all the names omitted.

If you know of a veteran who is missing from this list, please contact the Club with details.

The majority of players listed served in World War II. Veterans other than WWII have the theatre in which they served beside their name.

VALE HARRY KIMBLE - A True Club Man



The game of Rugby was one of Harry's life-long loves. Growing up in Concord, be became involved with the Club as a ball boy to first grade in 1953, then as a player before volunteering as video cameraman, committee member, archivist and eventually as the historian., supporting Wests through good times and bad.

Harry played for Wests early on, as did his father, Frank, who was a player and coach in the 1930s, then for Mosman, Port Hacking, Nepean and Greystanes Clubs, as he moved away from the area, until the 1990s when, living in Concord once again, he re-joined the Club. He spent some time on Committees and many hours travelling with his trustworthy backpack videoing Wests games.

He played in Golden Oldies teams, the "Black Knights" in 1983 and 1985, the latter enjoyed on a two week tour to London and Europe. In 2016 he went along as a supporter with a West Harbour team's 16-day tour to South Africa for a Festival of Rugby and to see the Australia v South Africa Test

In 1991 he travelled to South Africa as a journalist to report on the first Springboks test after apartheid was lifted and many trips were made to the Hong Kong Sevens

Harry could often be found late at night watching the streams of games with Georgia v Romania in the snow, or Spain v Portugal; he wrote many articles on International Rugby, including Women's in the 1990s, well before the internet. His research included translating Russian or Italian newspapers to source information.

Kimble has been a wonderful servant to the game of rugby, benefiting more than just the West Harbour community.

As well as volunteering for the Pirates, he was instrumental in forming rugby clubs in Greystanes, Blacktown and regularly contributed to rugby magazines across Europe and the Americas

As West Harbour Historian, his labour of love, he meticulously researched, wrote and self-published a detailed book on the history of Wests 1900-2011 "Against All Odds". In 2019 he updated it, publishing "The Caravan Moves On", 120 Seasons to 2019, ensuring that Wests' proud history will be celebrated.

When asked what team he supported, he always replied "the game". Although he followed the Wallabies, he supported other Countries, especially Argentina, France, Italy and Georgia and was excited when he saw them succeeding.

In recent years he loved to attend West Harbour home games and to have a chat with old friends and the younger players.

Harry had been looking forward to West Harbour returning to their home ground, and would have been so pleased to see that the improvement of facilities at Concord Oval has become a reality.






